THE JOY OF VOLUNTEERING

It is my privilege to see many people come weekly to volunteer at the Church. All come without fanfare, to do their works of mercy and service. February 22 and 23 will be a weekend where you will be given the chance to sign up to help with the ministry that goes on at Prince of Peace. Please consider what God might be asking you to do. Here is the testimony of many who serve.



I volunteer because:

- I was baptized and confirmed in a LCMS church that was my extended family. Actually, a lot of the members were family. My parents were very active in the church and passed that love of service to us, their children. I started teaching Sunday School at 16 and cannot imagine belonging to a church and not volunteering where needed.
- As a former teacher, I enjoy volunteering as a reader on Sunday and leading a Bible study for the Women of the Word on Wednesday. I am so blessed in return by learning more about God's word and learning about my friends, who I consider my extended family, at Prince of Peace. I also have a good time with everyone when we are in the kitchen preparing a meal for any occasion. It may be work, but the old adage is true, "many hands make light work."
- I enjoy accomplishing small projects.
- As a retiree. I have more time available to assist where I can.
- I enjoy serving the Church with other believers.
- I like the feeling of accomplishing tasks that support PoPLC and its people.
- I feel good about using our God-given talents to further God's work at PoPLC.

- I believe it makes God happy to see His people at work serving His people.
- Never thought of why, just felt it was something I should be doing as a Christian.
- I volunteer not for personnel satisfaction, but because I feel I'm useful and giving back to the church. In some sense I feel someone has to do it; so why not me? I also enjoy being an usher. I have get to meet the members who would otherwise just be a face in the crowd if I came in and sat down in a pew every Sunday. Ushers and greeters are the first people they meet when they come to Church for the first time and hopefully we are friendly and answer any questions they may have. The one program that I volunteered for that gives the most satisfaction is being a Grief Share Leader, Stacey Crosson asked me if I would be one of the leaders after I attended the first Grief Share Program. Seeing the change in the attitude of participants in the program after the 13 week sessions gives me a sense of accomplishment.
- The Church is much more than a Pastor or staff. The Church is the members. The Church depends on the members to make it a viable institution. That means volunteering. Volunteering provides fulfillment. What can I give back to the Church that the Church has given me over the years? My wife and I met in a Church and it has always been a part of our family. God sends messages and it's how we listen that provides us with the guidance needed to be part of the Church (and society).
- I became a church usher at age 12. My father was the chief usher at our church and also the local Scoutmaster. He was having a difficult time recruiting men to serve as ushers. Concurrently, the boys (many of whom were also Boy Scouts) were doing their "boys will be boys" antics in the back of the church. My father solved two problems with one decision. Use scouts as ushers. After that when an adult would complain about him using "boys to do a man's job", he would suggest to the complaintant that - being a man - would he be happy to volunteer for a month's worth of usher duty. Complaints fell off immediately. Furthermore, it taught us boys valuable lessons in service in the community and in dealing with people in public situations. Jesus has told us to be "a light unto the world" and "a city on the hill". The Bible says: "Faith without works is dead". How does one do these things - particularly today - in this locality? Many people are very reluctant to reach out in the secular world they live in; or are not allowed to speak in their Government/Contractor jobs about beliefs, values, and religion. In volunteering and being open to friends and associates that "you volunteer"; leads to subsequent discussions of "I am volunteering at church"; which leads to others seeing you as being a small "light unto the world". All we have to do is plant the seed and walk - the walk; the Holy Spirit does the rest. After many years of clawing my way up the ladder to success; often without achieving my satisfactory expectations, I fell into a state of depression and to drinking far too much. In times like these the Lord leads one to thought and deep introspection. It took months (years?) to come to the realization that being selfishly focused on my own goals was not leading to satisfying outcomes I had hoped for in life - in fact - it proved to be self-destructive. My revised philosophy was to admit I would not ever be the rising star which I hoped

to be, but rather change my focus to "Making Someone's Day" - every day. This can take many forms: a friendly greeting, a compliment given to those who rarely get compliments, giving a street panhandler \$20.00 for a meal when they say they are hungry (regardless of your associates saying you are being ripped off), getting a homeless person shelter in a snow storm, providing anonymous donation for a child's medical care, walking into a foodbank and giving them a One Hundred Dollar Bill and walking out. It is actually more enjoyable being God's anonymous hands in a world of woe and need, the illogical result is the more one does it - the more the assets become available to do more. Love ain't love less you give it away! Try it - make someone's day; particularly when they are down and out.

Update from the Senior Pastor Call Committee

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Senior Pastor Call Committee has completed the third round of phone interviews. We interviewed 7 candidates and are in the process of inviting 3 (maybe 4) of them for in person meetings. Those meetings will take place in January. We have a number of dates to put on the calendar. On the weekend of **January 11 and 12**, we will be holding informational meetings following all three services. They will last 15 to 20 minutes and we will announce the candidates who will be visiting and the dates of the visits. A Town Hall will be scheduled for **Saturday**, **February 1st at 2 p.m.** Much like the previous Call Committee Town Halls, we will have an open discussion of the candidates and decide if we are ready for a Call Service. Should we feel ready to proceed a Call Service will be held on **Sunday**, **February 9 at 3 p.m.**

We once again have a number of individuals who could fill the role of Senior Pastor and continue to pray that the Holy Spirit will give us the discernment to guide us to "God's Choice."

I recognize that with the return of the two prior calls there is some anxiety within the congregation as to why they were returned. Are we undesirable? Is it the cost of living in the area? Are we not offering adequate compensation? The reality is that the returned calls were more about the Pastors than about Prince of Peace. Pastor Adam had family considerations and did not feel his current call was in a place that allowed him to leave. Pastor Taylor also had family considerations. Both thought very highly of Prince of Peace and felt the compensation package was generous. Both did have sticker shock with the price of real estate, but that is not unexpected from anyone not coming from a similar market. Let not your hearts be troubled. 





In early December Mezmur made an important announcement to the participants in the Grace Ethiopian Family Church which he had been leading in succession of Pastor Zelleke. He would no longer be leading them, but instead would lead a new start in Ethiopian ministry that was committed to Lutheran teaching and which would be closely affiliated with Prince of Peace.

Since Pastor Zelleke was engaged in ministry elsewhere and since Wennie (Zelleke's wife) was in Ethiopia, all those who had been meeting as Grace Ethiopian continued to meet with Mezmur under his new commitments. A few weeks later when Wennie returned from Ethiopia she told those gathered that she supported this change and that she would join Zelleke in his new endeavors elsewhere. In effect this closed the ministry of the Grace Family Ethiopian Church.

So we rejoice in the clarity that this brings to the work of Mezmur. And we look forward to a fruitful relationship with those he gathers as brothers and sisters in Christ. If you would like to support Mezmur and this ministry, above and beyond your normal offerings to Prince of Peace, you may do so by making a contribution to the Ethiopian Outreach. All offerings being received by the Ethiopians are now handled through Prince of Peace's accounting. Expenses for Mezmur and this ministry are also being dispensed through Prince of Peace.
